The President's Message of Unity

Hello everyone! For those of you who do not know me I would like to introduce myself to you as your President for 2024. My name is Johnny Bruton, I am the Operations Manager of Streets & Drainage for the City of North Myrtle Beach of which I have been employed since 2006. I was originally hired as a Heavy Equipment Operator with the City. A few years into my career with the City I was granted the opportunity to further my education by attending Horry-Georgetown Technical College in the pursuit of a Civil Engineering Degree and finished up with a Degree from the University of



Ed Harne presented with the L.A. Williams, Jr. Award for extraordinary contributions to mosquito control in South Carolina and to the SCMCA.






Meet Your New Board Members!

I'm 24 years old, and a recent graduate from the University of South Carolina Columbia with a Bachelors in Public Health. I love to stay active, and enjoy visiting parks. One of my favorite things to do is visit Congaree National Park with my girlfriend!



Upper Region

The counties in the Upper Region are in preparation for the spring season. Treatments have not yet begun but they are hopeful for a mild summer!

Middle Region

Cheraw: Still doing routine spraying in the summer, have had less mosquito complaints this past season. This could be due to less standing water being present.

City of Columbia: Stacy Harris has changed positions from code enforcement officer to mosquito abatement services manager. This is so that he can more directly spearhead vector related pursuits. Mosquito complaints also fell dramatically this previous season, and mosquito numbers decreased as well.

Hartsville: No updates, but plans to attend SCMCA if nearby/budget allows.

Leesville: This season has had less mosquitoes compared to previous seasons. Heavier rainstorms have been happening recently which could be affecting mosquito numbers. Leesville is also working with local beekeepers and citizens who would like for their properties to not be sprayed. Leesville is also switching back to Aqua-Reslin this season after alternating between it and Permanone.

Lexington: James Hall recently returned after leaving in 2020. Lexington county is beginning deployment of Gravid and CDC Light traps for the first time. Lexington county is also working on creating a webpage to coordinate with local beekeepers to avoid harmful spraying practices.

Newberry: Matt Bartley retired recently, and the acting director Kip is seeking upcoming trainings and updates for when a more permanent director is chosen. Mosquito levels and complaints have been more or less the same this season.

Richland: The 2023 mosquito season in Richland County saw a decrease in West Nile Virus activity from the previous year, but maintained a similar amount of mosquito activity and service requests. The off-season has been spent focusing on training events and fully digitizing our program into our newly acquired MapVision software. Looking forward into 2024, we expect to hire an administrative assistant as well as another full-time inspector, which will bring us to three field staff. Our surveillance is set to begin in March and we are looking forward to what the year may bring!

St. Matthews: the past two seasons, complaints have been the lowest in 25 years. One employee is still attending workshops and conferences

Lower Region

Beaufort: Beaufort County Mosquito Control (BCMC) is gearing up for the mosquito control season. Our staff has had a busy "conference season" with lots of great experiences for education and networking. We attended the Society for Vector Ecology (SOVE) conference in September in Charleston, the 50th SCMCA Annual Conference, the Florida Mosquito Control Association (FMCA) annual conference, the FMCA Fly-In, and the Mid-Atlantic Mosquito Control Association (MAMCA) annual conference. Our technicians and other staff attended various FMCA Dodd Short Courses including the Advanced Mosquito Control course. We're looking forward to attending the AMCA annual conference in Dallas as well as the Arbovirus Surveillance and Mosquito Control Workshop at Anastasis Mosquito Control District.

With a lot of help from our County's GIS department, we've developed a comprehensive surveillance database using ESRI's ArcGIS Online system. We have fully implemented the database, but this will be the first season the complete system is used. It's fully operational, but we'll be making adjustments throughout the year to streamline the process even more.

Our aircraft are undergoing annual maintenance inspections and should be ready for calibration in April. We hired a new Chief Pilot, Bradley Rinehart, in October and we plan to be more aggressive in our aerial larviciding and adulticiding programs. We'll also begin our catch basin treatments in April with a more analytical approach by analyzing population and catch basin density using ArcGIS. This will help us be more efficient with our time and resources.

Charleston: Charleston County Mosquito Control wrapped up routine surveillance and treatment operations in early November to transition to winter maintenance and preparation for the 2024 season. We've been kept busy with the implementation of Fieldseeker Core and ULV to replace our current software. Looking forward, we're continuing to prepare for warmer weather as spring quickly approaches and will be calibrating our ULV sprayers later this month as well as our helicopter-mounted adulticide system in late March or early April. This is none-too soon, as our Spray Techs and Field Inspectors have been bringing in numerous late stage larval and pupal samples from throughout the county. The most important update we have is that of Ed Harne's retirement at the end of February after 38 years with Charleston County. Ed has been an invaluable resource to Charleston County Mosquito Control and beyond, and we wish him the most fruitful retirement; he's earned it. In the same vein, we will be hiring to fill the vacant position in the coming weeks. If anyone is interested in applying, keep an eye on Charleston County's careers website.

City of North Myrtle Beach: The City of North Myrtle Beach has experienced a very wet and warm winter. From our early surveillance activity we are already seeing increased number of larva from prior years. With that being said we a gearing up for a busy mosquito season. We have not added much by the way of equipment or staff over the winter this year but with the rapid growth of our City there is a great need for both. We have already started treating catch basins for the upcoming year and anticipate running all of our trap sites by the last week of February. We look forward to seeing each of you at the Summer Workshop in June!

Lower Region

Dorchester: Mosquito season can indeed be a challenge, particularly in areas like Dorchester County. Here are a few suggestions to help prepare and combat the mosquito population. Encourage residents to use EPA -approved mosquito repellents when spending time outdoors, especially during dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active. Mosquitoes breed in standing water, so it's essential to eliminate any stagnant water sources around homes and public areas. Regularly empty containers like flowerpots, bird baths, and gutters to prevent mosquitoes from laying eggs. Organize community cleanup events to remove debris and clear out areas where water can accumulate. This not only reduces mosquito breeding grounds but also enhances the overall appearance and cleanliness of the community. Implement mosquito control programs that may involve larviciding or adulticiding to manage mosquito populations in areas where breeding grounds are difficult to eliminate. Keep grass and vegetation trimmed to reduce hiding places for adult mosquitoes during the day. This can also help improve air circulation, making it less favorable for mosquitoes to rest. By implementing a combination of these strategies, Dorchester County can better prepare for the upcoming mosquito season and minimize the nuisance and health risks associated with mosquitoes.
